The Gaming Compact is in review, Chuck Zeh is working with the state and suggests we look at the Redline/ Blue Line Gaming Ordinance.

The Enrollment Ordinance 13-TM-01-ENR is going to be sent out to the public. Public discussion included Rights and Due Process. A news release is needed to be sent out for public awareness. BLM had many issues to discuss, Nobel Energy, Aturo mine, Grazing Permit Renewals, Sage Grouse Endangered Species List, Fracking. Rodeo Creek Mine. Tribal interest is needed with education. A management agreement is needed. This information was given only as information and not as consultation.

1749 Weyumb Lot Lease for Annissa Osborne was accepted by Resolution 13-TM-08 Evelyn made the motion and 2nd by Turk.
