RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY

INDIANS OF NEVADA

RESOLUTION NO: 15-TM-16

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TE-MOAK TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE TE-MOAK TRIBE OF WESTERN SHOSHONE INDIANS OF NEVADA, THAT:

WHEREAS, this organization is a recognized Indian organization as defined under the Indian Reorganization act of 1934, as amended, and exercises rights of home rule and is responsible for the promotion of the economic, health and welfare of its members; and

WHEREAS, the Te-Moak Tribe is the parent council for the communities of Elko, Battle Mountain, South Fork and Wells; and

WHEREAS, the Te-Moak Tribe enters an Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Inter Tribal Council of Arizona Inc. (ITCA) for a Comprehensive Approach to Good Health and Wellness in Indian Country;

WHEREAS, the ITCA Inc. Is not a not-for-profit Tribal consortium originally established in 1952, to provide a united voice for Tribal Governments located in the State of Arizona and Nevada to address common issues and concerns, including the health, safety and welfare of the ITCA Member Tribes. Currently, ITCA's membership includes 21 of the 22 Tribes in Arizona;

WHEREAS, the ITCA's Tribal Epidemiology Center ("ITCA TEC") is a public health authority pursuant to the requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (PubL. 104-191) ("HIPPA") and applicable law;

WHEREAS, ITCA TEC partners with Indian Tribes, nations, bands, and communities (collectively "Tribes") located within the Indian Health Services ("IHS") Phoenix and Tucson Service Areas, which includes significant portions of Arizona, Nevada and Utah, to assist tribes with health care matters and disease management;

WHEREAS, ITCA Health and Human Services ("ITCA HHS") provides Member Tribes and Tribes served by the IHS Phoenix and Tucson Service Areas Leadership, training and technical assistance in the areas of tribal early childhood, social services, and health promotion including chronic disease prevention;

WHEREAS, the Te-Moak Tribe is a federally recognized Indian Tribe vested with responsibility and authority to protect and enhance health, safety and welfare of its Tribal community members;

WHEREAS, the Te-Moak Tribe has expressed interest to prevent heart diseases, diabetes, stroke, and associated risk factors in their respective tribal community using a holistic approach to population health and wellness through implementing a variety of effective community chosen and culturally adapted policies, systems and environmental changes to address on or more of the following areas attached to this Resolution:

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APPROVED: April 1, 2015

THEREFORE, the Te-Moak tribe will be doing a Memorandum of Agreement providing a 5 year grant provided in the Tribal Administration report on 03/04/15 and agreed upon. The Grant is the Comprehensive Approach to Good Health in Indian Country Contract #CDCFY1515
